He has received many honors for his progressive and landmark contributions on the specialized subject of the psychology of African-Americans. He is the author of several bestselling books and numerous scholarly papers and articles. Dr. Akbar has also appeared on the "Oprah Winfrey Show," "Tony Brown's Journal," "The Geraldo Show" and many other national and local television programs. He has also been the subject of articles in national publications, including the Washington Post.
